January 28, 2026

Call to Order

Co-Chair Parmer called the meeting to order at 5:08 p.m.

Flag Salute - Commissioner Allgood

Commissioner Allgood led the flag salute.

Roll Call

Commissioner Anderson was absent during roll call and joined the meeting at 5:13 p.m.

Public Comment

Tatiana Partain, Management Analyst with the Planning and Development Services Department, provided an overview of Wayfinding, a series of projects focused on signage throughout the City of Clovis, including park signage related to bicycle use and major city entry signs. Commissioners asked questions and shared comments regarding existing signage and their observations of signs around the community.

Opening Business

1. Approve Minutes from the November 19, 2025, Regular Meeting.

Motion by Commissioner Mathur, Seconded by Commissioner Hammond, the Minutes for November 19, 2025, regular meeting, were approved. Motion carried by 19-0-2, with Commissioners Ndole and Tukhar absent.

2. Measure Y Oversight Committee Report Out by Ex-Officio Moore.

Commissioner Moore reported to the Commission on key takeaways from the quarterly meeting, including updates on the City's use of Measure Y funds, public outreach efforts, and the measure's impact on the community through staffing and park improvements.

3. Update on Hmong American Friendship Event by Commissioner Yang.

Commissioner Yang reported that, at the Mayor's invitation, she attended and spoke at a

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Hmong American Friendship meeting, which was well attended by influential members of the Hmong community.

Regular Agenda

4. Update from the Ad Hoc Committee regarding "Threads of Joy" Clothing Drive.

The Mental Health Committee reported on the Threads of Joy clothing drive, which collected a total of 743 clothing items during the week-long event. The City Clerk and Assistant City Manager will deliver the donated items to EPU on Friday, January 30, 2026, for distribution to youth residents of Clovis.

5. Status Update from the Ad Hoc Committee regarding Substance Abuse - Tobacco Policy.

The Tobacco/Substance Abuse Committee reported out that it compiled a list of addresses throughout the city that are designated for youth use, including schools, parks, and tutoring sites, to help prevent the sale of tobacco products in those areas. The Committee also reported that it will be closing the loop today with Police Corporal Moring regarding potential future policy amendments to the ordinance.

6. Status Update from the Ad Hoc Committee regarding E-Bike and Scooter Safety.

The E-Bike and Scooter Safety Committee reported out that it met during the Christmas break to plan E-bike and scooter safety videos and is in the process of finalizing the video scripts.

7. Ad Hoc Committee Team Breakout.

The Mental Health Committee reported that the group has completed its project and will now assist with and help finalize the E-Bike and Scooter Safety Ad Hoc Committee's final project.

The Tobacco/Substance Abuse Ad Hoc Committee reported the group has completed its project and will also assist with finalizing the E-Bike and Scooter Safety project. The Committee further reported that its tobacco policy focused on identifying youth safety zones to support upcoming amendments to the ordinance, such as a limit of tobacco products within 500 feet and a substance-free zone in areas where the tough may be impacted. The Ad Hoc Committee worked with their mentors in the Clovis Police Department who will draft a final policy, bring the draft to the Commission on February 25, 2026, for the Commission's review, then to the City Council for discussion and consideration.

The E-Bike and Scooter Safety Ad Hoc Committee reported that they revised their original plan and will now produce two safety videos: one longer video for schools and a shorter version for social media. The Committee will share draft scripts at the February meeting and will continue working with mentors to ensure the videos are ADA compliant and ready for release in advance of the May 2, 2026, Trail Fest event. City Clerk Parra

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
will also provide the Commission with additional information and education related to E-Bike safety.

The Trail Fest/Helmet Giveaway Ad Hoc Committee reported that it will receive funds from the Clovis Police Department for the purchase of helmets for youth and is coordinating with the Police Department to host a shared booth at Trail Fest on Saturday, May 2, 2026. The Committee plans to provide bicycle safety education, distribute helmets to youth, and host a bike safety station along the trail, including tire inflation and basic bike safety checks with assistance from Police Department bike unit officers. Informational pamphlets are expected to be completed by the February meeting.
